TV Disturbances Due to Seasonal Sun Interference

Beginning in early October and continuing through the middle of the month, disturbances to TV signal reception may occur when the sun passes directly behind a satellite. This usually lasts only a few minutes and is a natural phenomenon that affects both satellite and cable company reception.

Ghosts premiers on October 7 on CBS (channel 3).


Queens (ABC)


